Abstract:

This eclectic collection assembled by Virginia Shaw and other residents of the Ardens contains materials related to various Arden institutions as well as the villages' planning, safety, and community planning committees. It also includes material on the Single Tax movement from the early 20th century, documents related to the management of town records, materials from the Arden Arts assessment, and various newspaper clippings and ephemera related to life in the Ardens.

Biographical Note:

Virginia Shaw was a long-time resident of Arden, Delaware. Born in 1906, Shaw worked in the Delaware State Archives' office for more than 30 years and was assistant state archivist at the time of her retirement in the 1970s. She was also a member of the

Merry-Go-Rounders, a women's group in the Ardens whose motto was "We go round and round doing good and having a merry time of it." Virginia Shaw passed away in 1989.

A number of items in this collection pertain to events that took place after Shaw's death, suggesting that they came from another source.

Scope and Content:

This eclectic collection assembled by Virginia Shaw and other residents of the Ardens contains materials related to various Arden institutions as well as the villages' planning, safety, and community planning committees. It also includes material on the Single Tax movement from the early 20th century, documents related to the management of town records, materials from the Arden Arts assessment, and various newspaper clippings and ephemera related to life in the Ardens.

A large portion of the collection relates to civic organizations and standing committees within the villages. Materials from the planning, safety, and community planning committees show discussions of budgets, zoning, and historic preservation in the community. The collection includes permission forms issued by the Arden Civic Committee between 1979 and 1989 for use of the Arden Commons. There are also several items pertaining to the Arden Library, Arden Craft Shop Museum, and the Montessori School located in the Buzz Ware Village Center.

Another grouping of documents illustrates the villages' interactions with Delaware state government, especially the Department of Highways and Transportation. These include materials regarding the widening of Marsh Road, a safety study of Harvey Road, and a project to diminish flooding around Naaman's Creek. Correspondence with the Delaware State Division of Historical and Cultural Affairs shows the community's interest in erecting an historical marker.

In the mid-1980s, the Village of Arden undertook an inventory of its town records, gathering information on documents held by the assessors, town clerk, and several standing committees. Materials in the collection suggest that the village was applying from a records management grant from the state of Delaware. This grouping includes records management procedures from the state of Delaware and lists of documents from the Ardens held by the Delaware Historical Society. Given her background as an archivist, it's possible that Virginia Shaw spearheaded this effort to manage Arden's records.

This collection also contains a small grouping of materials pertaining to the Single Tax movement in the early 20th century. This grouping includes correspondence between Joseph Fels and Daniel Kiefer regarding the land nationalization movement and letters and newspaper articles discussing William S. U'Ren's attempts to implement Georgist principles in Oregon dating between 1911 and 1916.

The Virginia Shaw collection also includes several poems by Frank Stephens, artistic collaborations between Stephens and Buzz Ware, songs, and album pages featuring theater programs, telegrams, newspaper clippings, and annual reports from Arden institutions.

The collection contains a small grouping of materials created after Shaw's death and likely assembled by another resident. These items include documents related to the Arden Arts Assessment, the National Planning Landmark Award, and a manuscript copy of David Clark's 2000 master's thesis on Arden.
